



Check in the mirror to see if your clothes are appropriate for work.


inappropriate - not proper, not correct

Maria hated to get up for work.



Maria thought, "Good thing Mom didn't open the door all the way!"


A moment later, Maria heard her squeaky bedroom door open. Maria thought, "Good thing the lights are out so Mom can't see this room!"




"Hey, Nat, how do you decide what to wear?"
